

Cotgrave Country Park

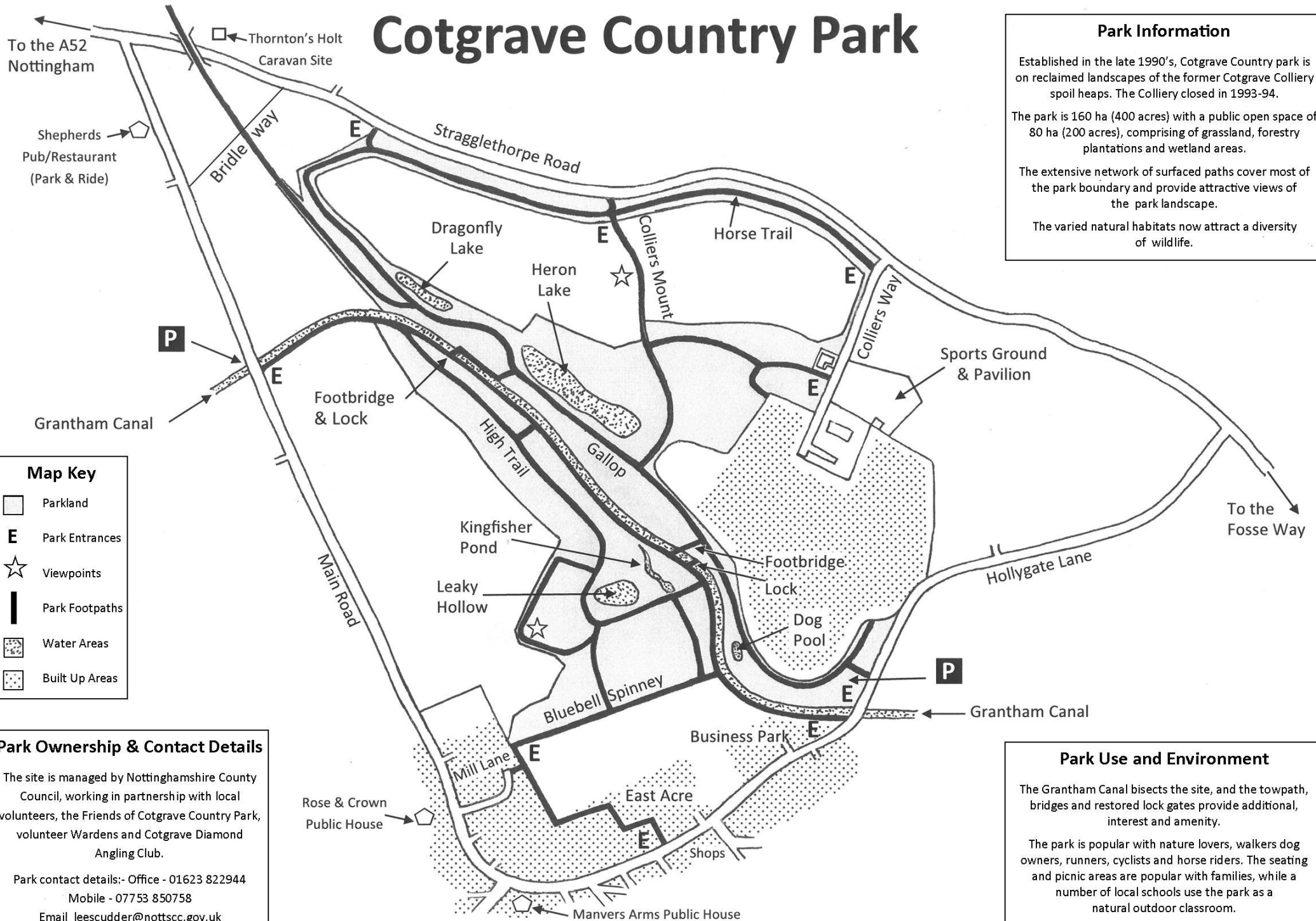
Park Information

Established in the late 1990's, Cotgrave Country park is on reclaimed landscapes of the former Cotgrave Colliery spoil heaps. The Colliery closed in 1993-94.

The park is 160 ha (400 acres) with a public open space of 80 ha (200 acres), comprising of grassland, forestry plantations and wetland areas.

The extensive network of surfaced paths cover most of the park boundary and provide attractive views of the park landscape.

The varied natural habitats now attract a diversity of wildlife.
